Our Mission

Saving babies lives, keeping kids safe and building strong families. Our team is fully committed to preventing child abuse and neglect by providing emergency intervention, respite care and support for families with children ages birth through 12 years.

Our Programs

Crisis Care For Kids:

Provides short-term care for children, at 5 Nursery locations, whose families are at risk of abusing their child.

24-Hour Helpline:

365 day a year source of support, crisis intervention and referrals for families at risk of abuse and/or neglect.

Family Empowerment Program:

Offers crisis counseling, community referrals, home visitation, Parent Education and support groups.

Community Outreach:

Provides information on child abuse prevention and Crisis Nursery services through advocacy with legislators, community presentations and consulting services.

Top Five Reasons

To support child abuse prevention and the Saint Louis Crisis Nursery:

- 1) More than 86% of all revenue goes directly towards emergency care of children and Family Empowerment Programs.
- 2) Every year more than 7,100 children find a safe haven at the Crisis Nursery.
- 3) Every hour, one child in Missouri is abused or neglected.
- 4) The Crisis Nursery is there 24-7 to help children and families in need.
- 5) 99% of children do not experience abuse or neglect while their families are benefitting from Crisis Nursery programs and services.

Accomplishments in 2010:

PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS

24-Hour Helpline

- 6,695 parents called for help during a crisis;
- 54% admitted their child to one of the five Crisis Nurseries;
- 46% of parents were able to resolve the crisis through counseling and referrals by Crisis Nursery Staff;

Crisis Care for Kids

- 7,197 children were provided more than 215,000 of safe, nurturing care;
- 5,686 children received a medical exam;
- 1,050 children received individualized therapy through our Children's Therapeutic Program;

Family Empowerment Program

- 3,187 parents reported a significant drop in stress after using Crisis Nursery services;
- 2,281 Home Visits were provided to families;
- 194 parents participated in Parent Education Groups
- 996 Teens participated in Teen Parenting Education Groups

REVENUE AND EXPENSES For the Year Ending June 30, 2010

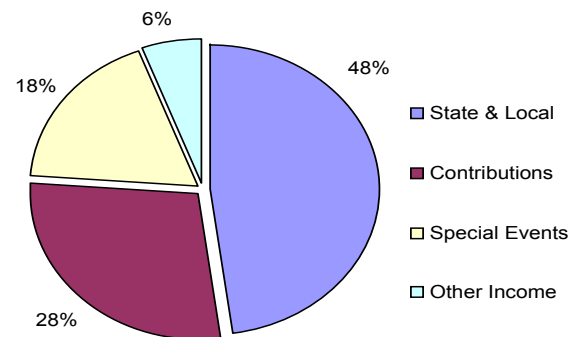

Total Support and Revenue: \$3,244,431

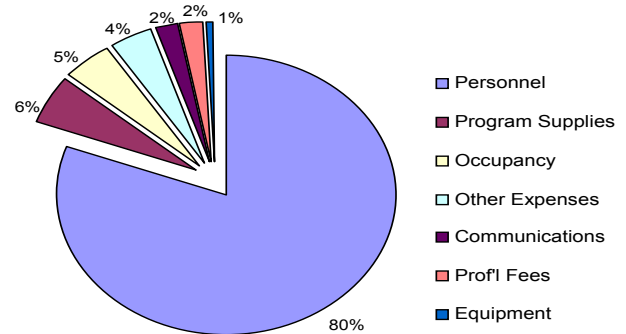
Total Expenses: \$2,777,708

CRISIS NURSERY OUTCOMES:

99% of the children did NOT receive a substantiated child abuse hotline.

99% of children discharged from the Crisis Nursery did not have to be placed in alternative care and remained in their natural family home.
